Every year scammers defraud the public of hundreds of millions of dollars by selling fake services and worthless products for everything from immigration, housing and health to debt collection, jobs and education.

Impostors threaten people with deportation if they fail to pay non-existent fines or fees, which is one factor in why people rarely report fraud. Fresno has a low level of complaints filed with the FTC.

Our briefing will bring together law enforcement officials, community advocates and victims of fraud to talk about what the media and civic leaders can do to protect themselves and better inform people. Information is the best antidote to fraud.
