Casey works at a store to *earn* money. She gets her paycheck and pay stub biweekly. Her employer *deducts/withholds* money for taxes and *benefits/retirement*. The *earnings/deductions/withholdings* are listed on her pay stub. Casey is careful to make consistent contributions to her *retirement* account because her employer also contributes through a *match*. When Casey gets her paycheck, she goes to her bank to *cash/deposit* it. She usually *deposits* half and gets the rest in *cash*. Casey gets a W-2 at the end of the year that details her *earnings* and *deductions/withholdings*.
